Share of foreign-born people in the Nordic countries

- Foreign-born shares of the populations in the Nordic countries are at historical high levels
- Over the past several decades, twothirds of the population growth has been from immigration (the other third has been from more births than deaths)
- While migration cannot stop the ageing process completely, it is one possible measure to boost labour forces and to slow population ageing in the short term.













- Large increase in foreign-born population both nationally and regionally in all Nordic countries and regions.
- General trend is positive international migration in peripheral regions and negative internal migration.
