*Abstention + Populist vote**

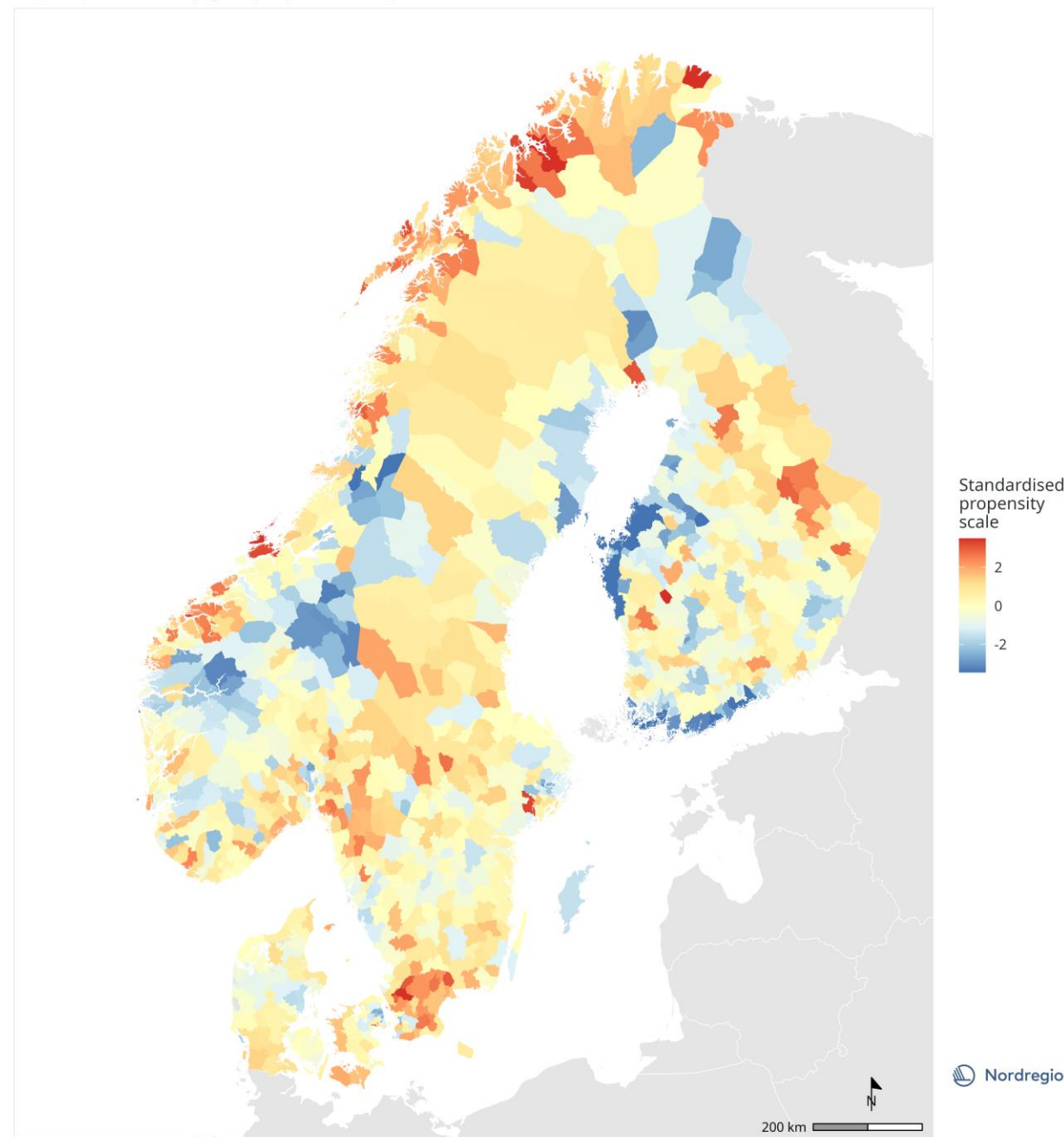

Propensity to vote for a 'populist party' or abstaining in national elections



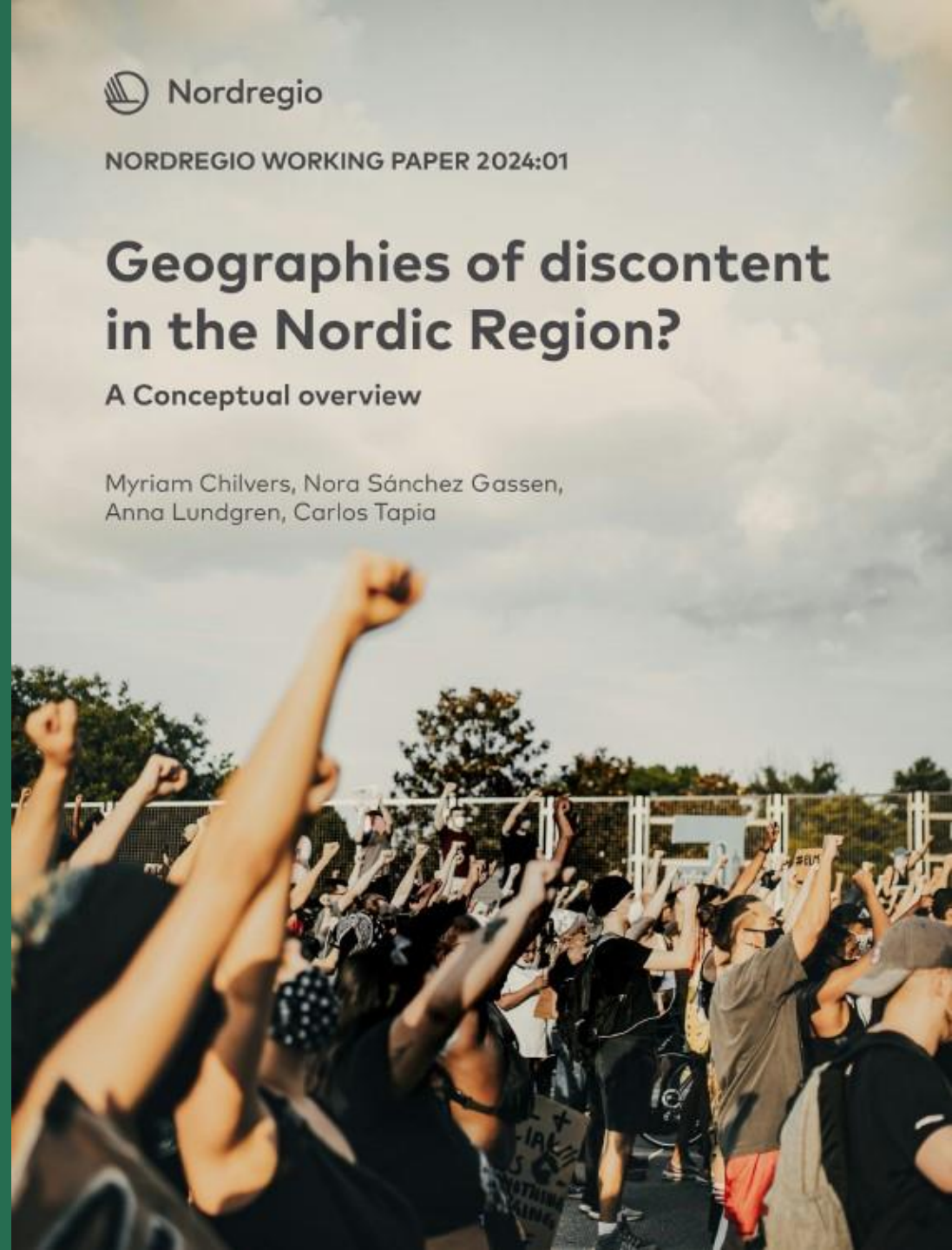
Understanding the root causes of discontent in western liberal democracies

4. **The green transition?**

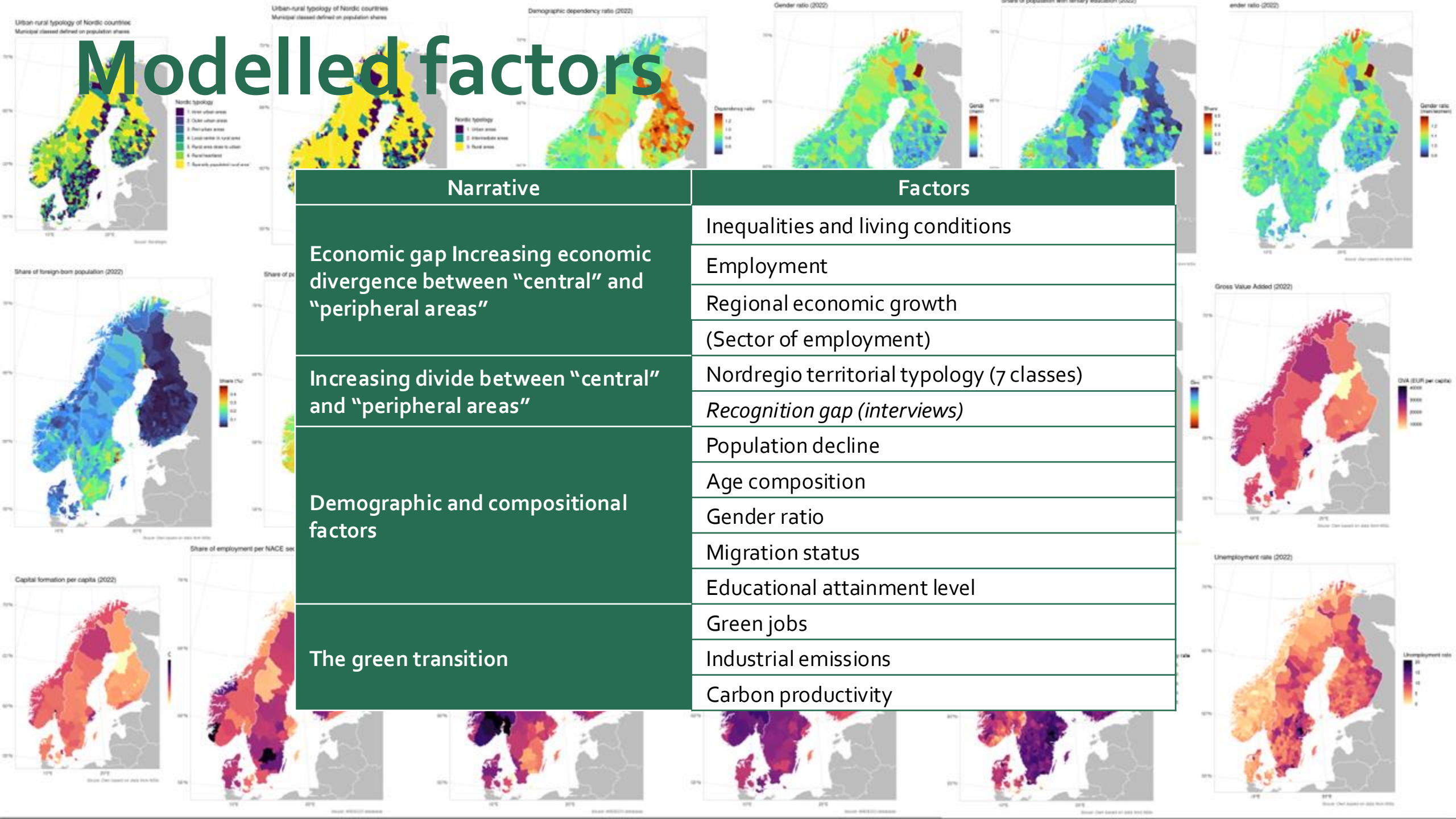

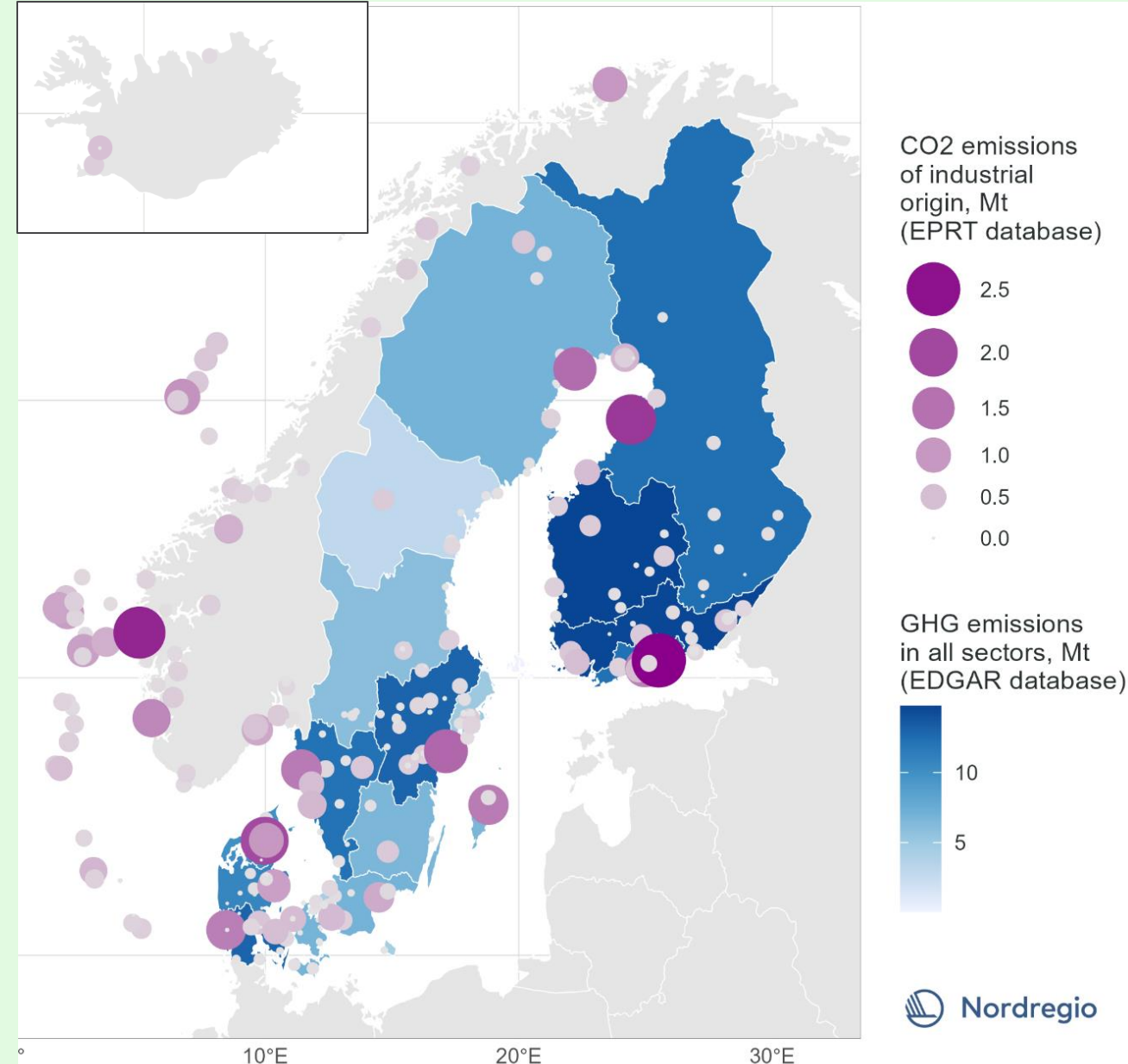

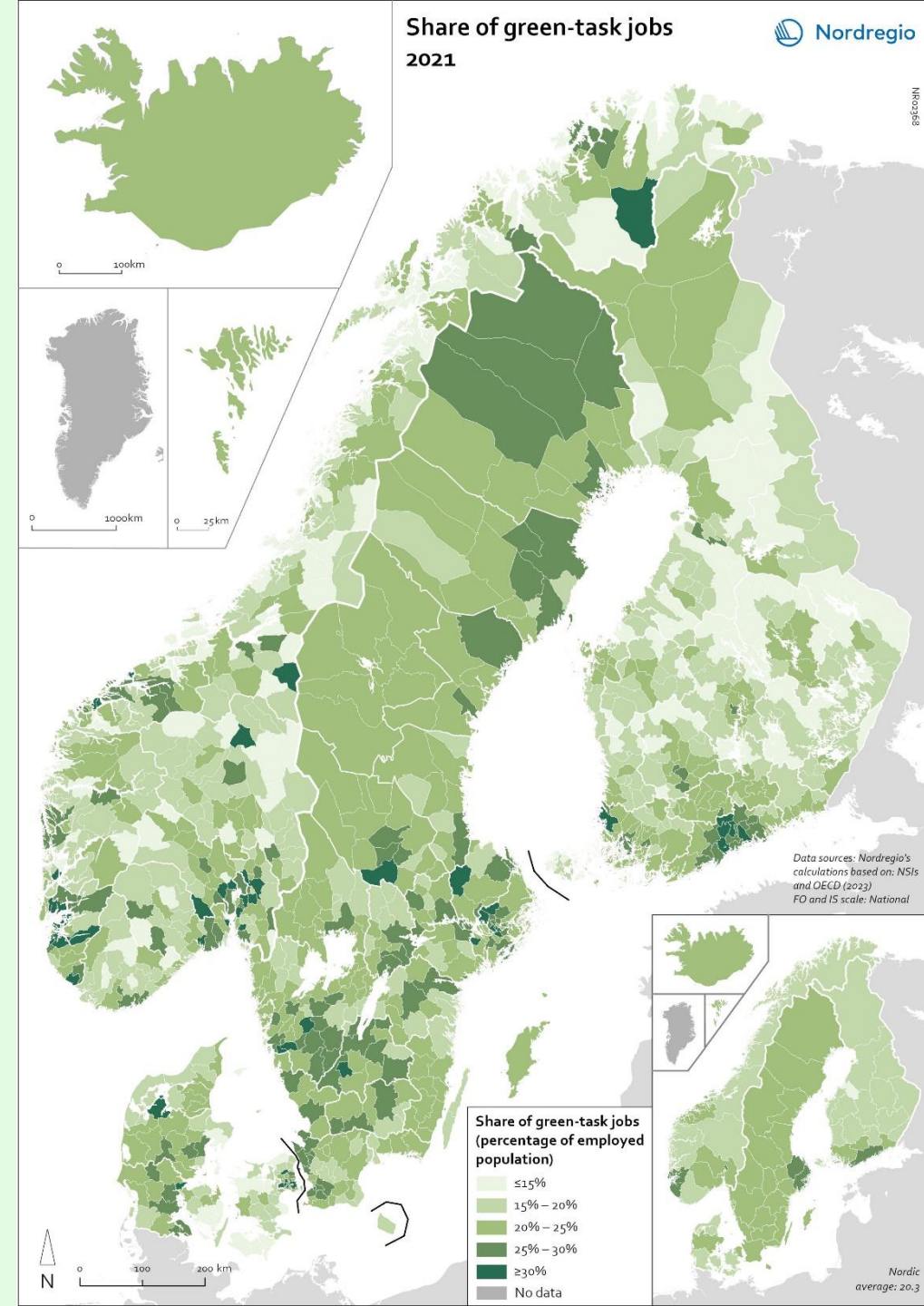
The green transition: Localised GHG emissions

Nearly **half** of all **GHG emissions** in the Nordic Region are generated by large **industrial and energy facilities** listed in the EPRTTR.

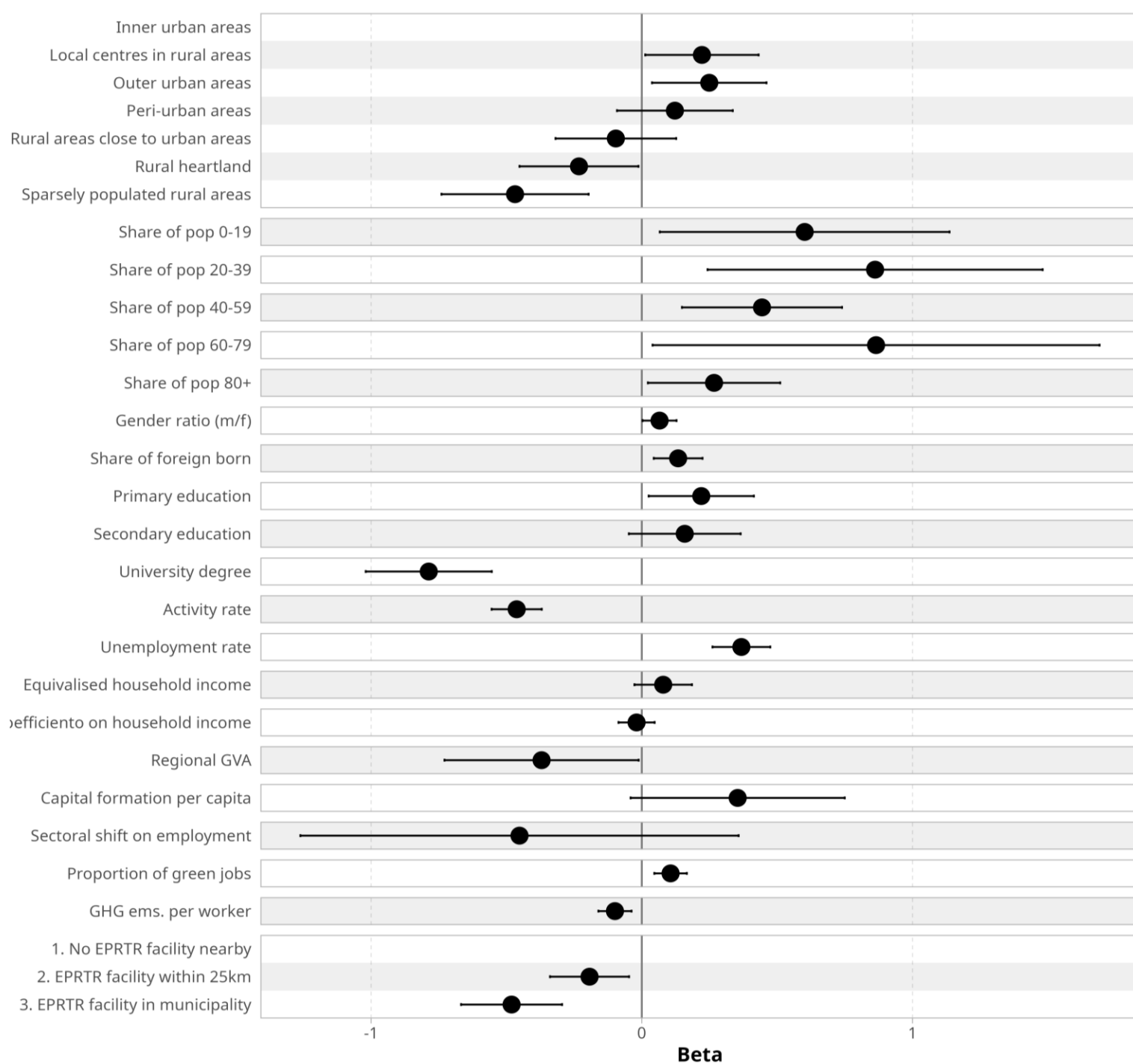
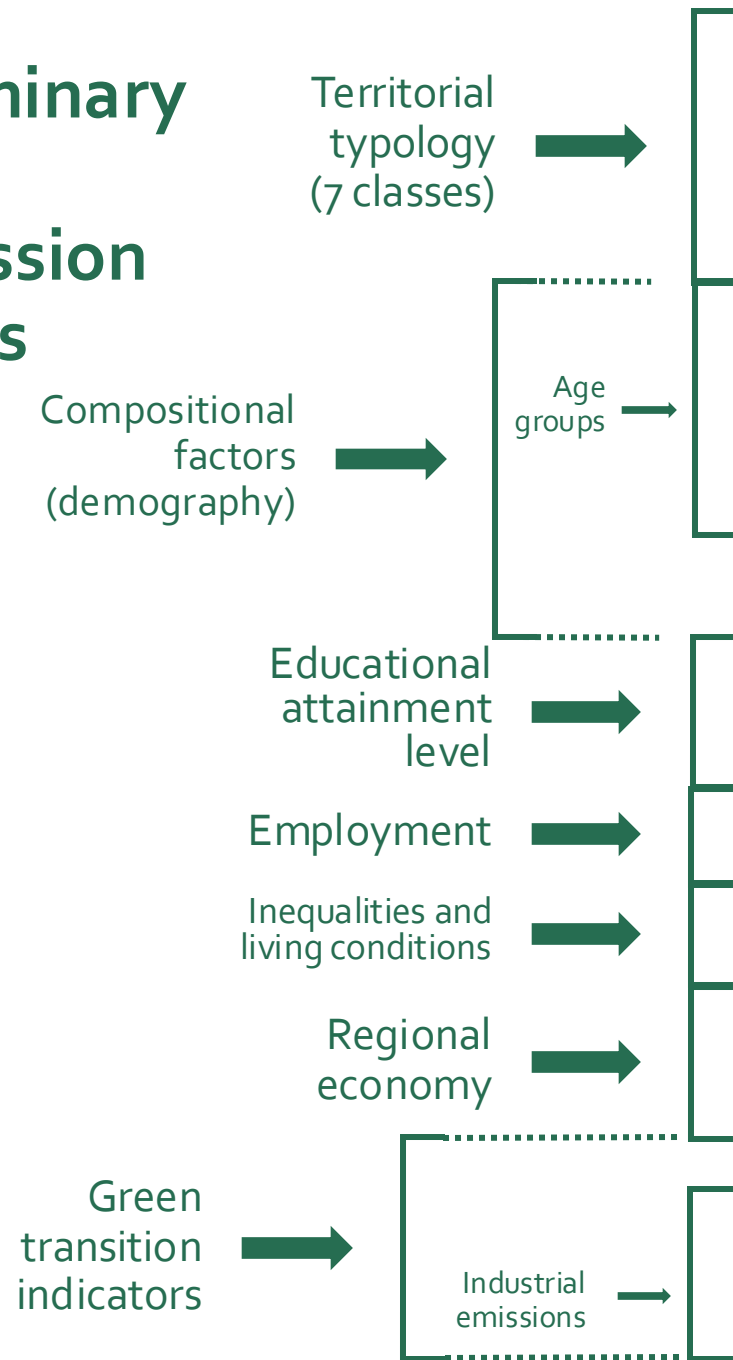


The green transition: Green jobs

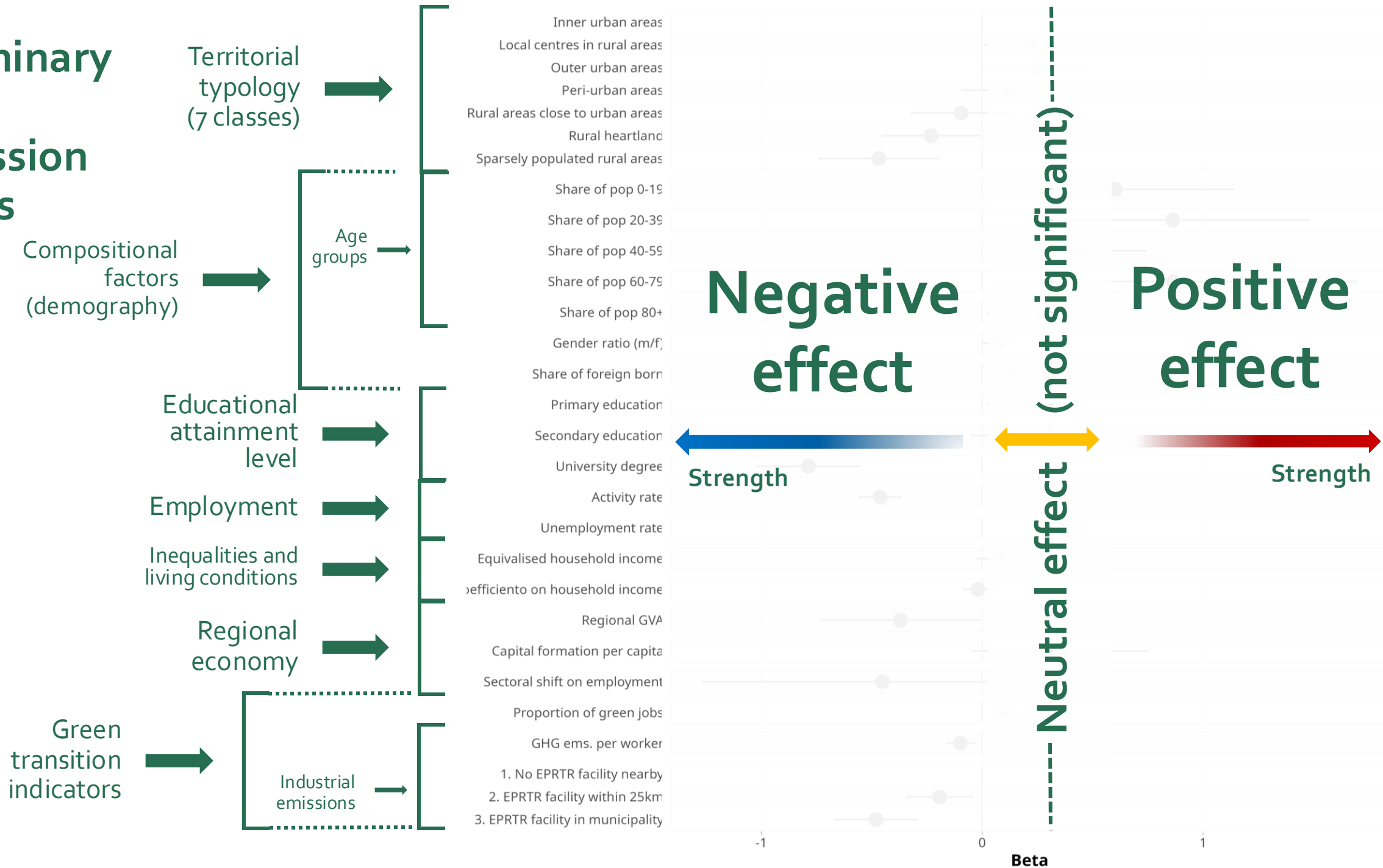
- In 2021, ca. **3.4 million jobs** classified as 'green'
- 25.2% of total employment
- **Urban areas** exhibit a greater prevalence of green jobs – on average **28%** in urban areas vs. **21%** in rural areas.
- The Green transition is in its early phases and there is a demand for **new skills and innovations**.
- Green jobs are correlated with **higher education** and a **skilled workforce**



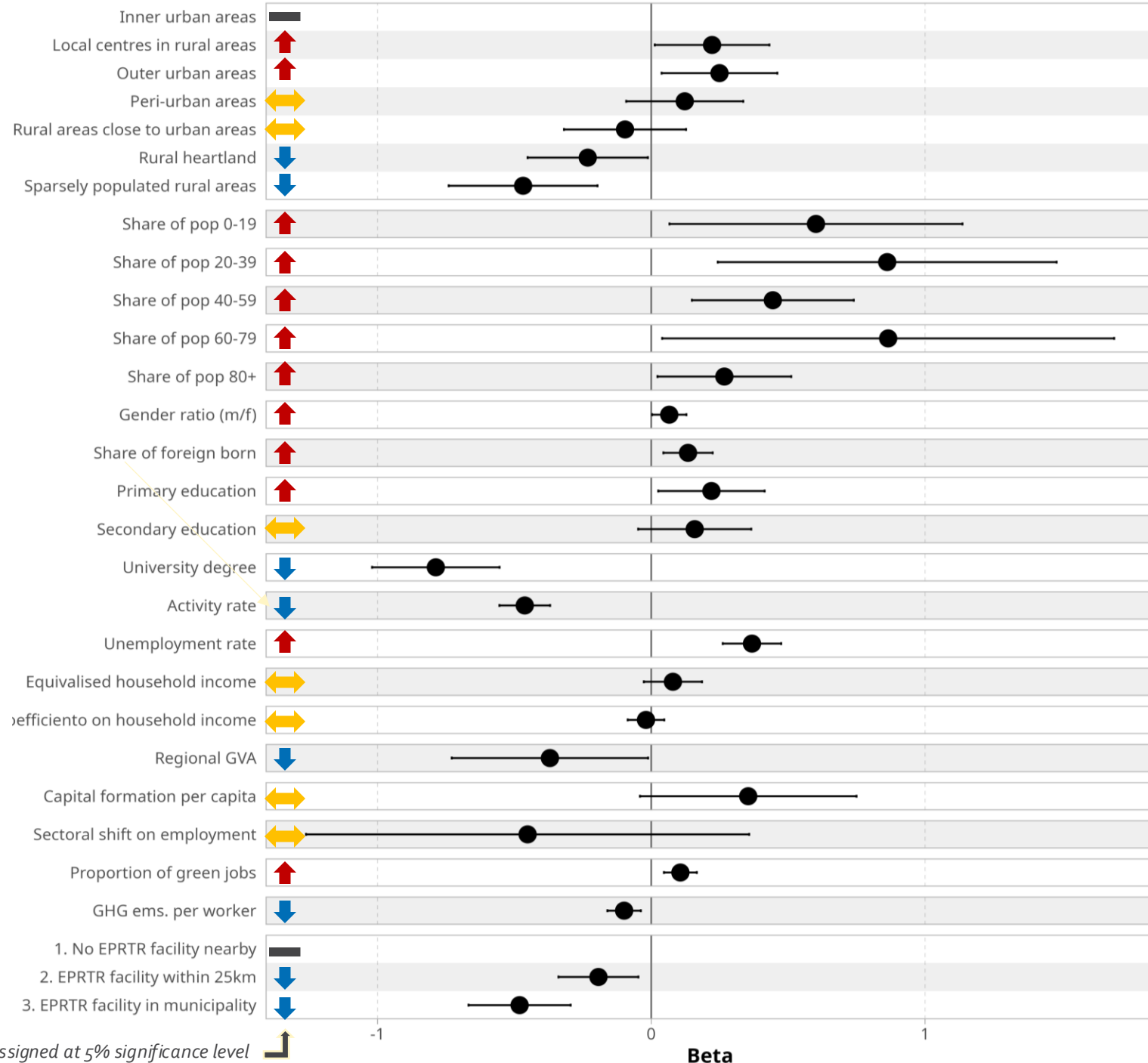
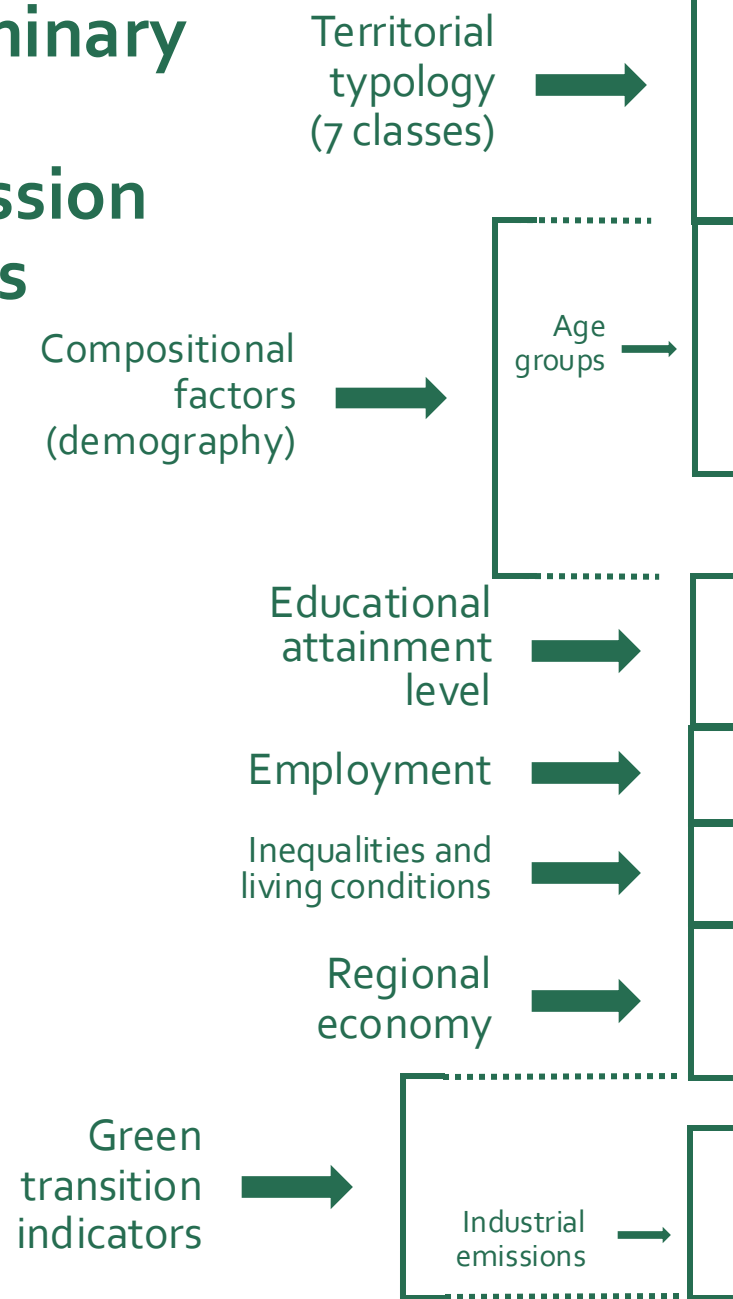
Preliminary OLS regression results
